Lord Green of Hurstpierpoint

Lord Green began his career with the British Government's Ministry of Overseas Development. In 1977, he joined McKinsey & Co, before moving to The Hongkong and Shanghai Banking Corporation in 1982. In 1998, he was appointed to the Board of HSBC Holdings plc as Executive Director, Investment Banking and Markets. He became Group Chief Executive in 2003 and Group Chairman 2006. He retired from HSBC in December 2010.

Lord Green was created a Life Peer in 2010 and was appointed Minister of State for Trade and Investment in January 2011. He retired from this position in December 2013.

He is Chairman of the Natural History Museum and Chairman of the International Advisory Council of the British Chambers of Commerce. He is an ordained priest in the Church of England.

Julia Cleverdon

DCVO, CBE

Dame Julia Cleverdon DCVO, CBE is a passionate and practical campaigner who has gained an international reputation for 'connecting the unconnected', inspiring individuals and organisations to work together for the common good.

As Vice President of *Business in the Community* and Special Adviser to *The Prince's Charities* – concentrating on responsible business practice and the Place Strategy to improve disadvantaged communities – she promotes collaboration among senior leaders from business, government, education and community organisations to build a more robust civil society.

Julia is Vice Patron of *Teach First* and serves on the Board of *Teach for All*. She was appointed to chair the *National Literacy Trust* in 2013 and also chairs *Read on Get on*. She co-founded the *Campaign for Youth Social Action* and is a board member of *National Citizen Service*. She chairs the advisory board of the *Newnham College Campaign* and is an external adviser to *Carillion's Sustainability Advisory Committee*.
